GREETINGS & INTRODUCTIONS:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jonson at 10:05 a.m. Introductions were made.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

No members of the public were present.

OLD BUSINESS:

3. Upon a motion by Mr. Hoyt and seconded by Mr. Palozzi, the summary of the February 14, 2014 meeting was approved.
4. Mr. Jonson and Ms. Leonard informed the group that the City Council approved the Clearwater Maintenance Agreement at their 5/15 meeting.
5. Ms. Leonard reported that the connection to the Ream Wilson Trail will be funded with Penny for Pinellas to ensure construction is completed prior to May 2015. Design is currently at 50%. Ken remarked surprise at the narrow corridor and general lack of space for amenities along the corridor. The group discussed the availability (or lack thereof) of funds from the Pinellas MPO.
6. Ms. Young noted that the City is reviewing a draft agreement with Hillsborough County for trail improvements. 911 marker locations have not yet been identified. She also informed the group of a volunteer planting event organized by Keep Tampa Bay Beautiful scheduled for July 19th. Finally, Ms. Young shared a preliminary map of the Courtney Campbell Trail. Comments included using the map on a tri-fold brochure, including the number of available parking spaces, adding the Scenic Highway logo, including a link to the City's website, incorporating total mileage in addition to segment miles, revising the distance markers, showing the location of restrooms and including the trail rules.
7. Ms. Burke reported that Ms. Reynolds would not be writing a letter of recommendation for the USF students but she was willing to provide the raw video file and release.

NEW BUSINESS:

8. Mr. Jonson summarized the Scenic Byway Workshop and informed the group of an upcoming presentation to the TBAG. He requested that CAC members provide photographs, information of economic benefit, etc. Mr. Hoyt noted that this is an example of when reporting the number of users would be helpful.

9. Mr. Jonson reviewed previous changes proposed for the Management Plan and facilitated a discussion Goal 3: Build Community Support for Long-term Success. See attached revisions.

OTHER BUSINESS:

No other items were discussed.
