1. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jonson at 10:07 a.m. Introductions were made.
2. Mr. Tindall noted that the right of way had been mowed and weed whacked on the westbound side. He also stated that the palm fronds should be picked up and is looking forward to the completion of construction so that the Pinellas side of the scenic highway will look good once again. Ms. Marable committed to researching the status of the "conservation areas" discussed.
3. Upon a motion by Mr. Hoyt, seconded by Mr. Gregory, the November meeting summary was unanimously approved.
4. Ms. Leonard reviewed the status of the proposed connection to the Ream Wilson trail and the number of parking spaces available in the vicinity of the beach and trail head (62).
5. Ms. Burke summarized Mr. Palozzi's review of the CCSCCH website. Mr. Jonson requested that Mr. Hoyt formulate a proposal for potential revisions to be presented at an upcoming meeting.
6. Dana Shores Neighborhood Association ultimately accepted the CAC's advice to hire an attorney to represent their interests at the public hearing. Staff was ultimately directed to enforce the law regarding noise and parking. The zoning request has not been approved.
7. The new report format was discussed briefly. Ms. Marable and Mr. Palozzi informed the group that the report would be due March 16th and should be an agenda item during the February meeting.
8. Ms. Leonard shared preliminary thoughts and concerns regarding the future configuration of the beach area located at the western end of the Courtney Campbell Causeway. Questions to be resolved include entry gates, turn lanes and parking availability.
9. Members discussed a range of issues including the status of amenities to accommodate fishing activities and challenges associated with establishing a bike rental program.

Mr. Tindall requested an agenda item pertaining to exotics on the Pinellas portion of the CCSCCH.

The next meeting is scheduled for February 20th. The meeting adjourned at 11:35 a.m.
