1. Bill Jonson called the meeting to order at 10:15 AM. Introductions were made.
2. Public Comment: Mr. Tindale commended the FDOT for their improved maintenance activities and complimented how beautiful the Causeway looked for Christmas.
3. Meeting Summary: Upon a motion by Mr. Hoyt and seconded by Mr. Gregory, the meeting summary was unanimously approved.
4. Pinellas Trail Head: Former FDOT construction management office owned by FDEP was actually originally owned by the City of Clearwater and was declared surplus and donated for use as the construction office. Ream Wilson connector trail is approximately 2 weeks from completion.
5. Pinellas Amenities Request: Amenities funding request has not yet been made. Mr. Smith will put the CCT Master Plan on the Pinellas Bike/Pedestrian Committee agenda. Ms. Leonard should provide the plans to Mr. Smith. Mr. Smith mentioned that the Friendship Trail Bridge has restroom facilities that could potentially be repurposed for the CCT.
6. Comments on the 2015 FSHP Byway Annual Report Form are due to Maya by 1/22. Maya will send electronic version to email list.
7. Other Items:
  - a. The CCT will be part of the Coast to Coast connector corridor linking through downtown Tampa to Manatee County. Mr. Tindale asked about hurricane vulnerability and reconstruction.
  - b. Questions were raised about dog regulations on the trail and the beach and concerns were expressed about dead palms and contractor liability on the Hillsborough side.

## FLORIDA SCENIC HIGHWAYS PROGRAM

Guest speaker Amanda Hardeman presented a slide show describing the Florida Folklife Program and its emphasis on storytelling. A pdf of her presentation is attached.

It was announced that the revised FSHP Procedure has been signed by the FDOT Secretary, and details will be announced soon regarding the launch of the revised FSHP policy.

### Action Item Updates:

1. Revise FSHP Guidance to include SHAC review of Letters of Intent during the Eligibility Phase.

*This revision has been made to the FSHP Guidance.*

2. Restructure the format of SHAC meetings to include presentations that could be attended by all members of the byway community via video or teleconference.

*This April meeting is the first to adopt the new format.*

3. FSHP will update the SHAC on the outcome of a scheduled meeting between FSHP and Visit Florida.

*The result of the October 2015 meeting between FSHP staff and Visit Florida was a commitment by Visit Florida to produce a short article on each of the scenic highways.
