FHWA is partnering with State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and others to assess, develop and deploy resilience solutions to extreme weather events, reducing future maintenance costs over the life-cycle of transportation assets and decreasing the social and economic impact to the community.

3. **Forward Pinellas Long Range Transportation Plan** (2:40 pm – 3:10 pm)

Advantage Pinellas is a strategic plan to improve mobility and economic opportunity countywide. As a metropolitan planning organization, Forward Pinellas determines what transportation projects should receive state and federal funding in Pinellas County with its long-range plan. The plan identifies the major transportation needs for our communities and enables them to receive critical funding in the future – without inclusion in the plan, a transportation project cannot be eligible for this funding resource and may not be built. Forward Pinellas creates a new Long-Range Transportation plan every five years and is in the process of developing that plan – the Advantage Pinellas plan – now.
