- Government leadership -- integrate resilience into everything – plans, budgets processes, create performance metrics

RRAP REVIEW PROCESS & TIMELINE

Mid-April -- Draft sent to Management Planning Committee and Steering Committee. **No Committee meeting in April.**

April 29th/30th – virtual meetings with MPC to get input.

May 10 -- **Steering Committee provides input.**

May-June County and City input meetings. Community input via MetroQuest and Partner stakeholder input via zoom. **No Committee meeting in June.**

August 9 – Steering Committee Meeting. Review, discuss and approve near final draft. Vote to recommend to Council.

Sept.13 – Steering Committee meeting. Present Plan to Council.
